

Salutations to Pūjya Śrī Swāmī Dayānanda Saraswatiji

ओम् नमो भगवते श्री दक्षिणामूर्तिस्वरूपाय श्री दयानन्दरूपाय
परमगुरवे परमात्मने

Om namo bhagavate śrī dakṣiṇāmūrti-svarūpāya śrī dayānanda-rūpāya paramagurave
paramātmane

Salutations unto Bhagavan in the form of the exalted teacher, Śrī Dayānanda, who is essentially Śrī Dakṣiṇāmūrti himself.

om – a sound symbol of the Lord, the whole; an auspicious utterance; a single syllable consisting of three sounds, used at the beginning of prayers

namo – is *namaḥ* – salutations

bhagavate – unto the Lord, to *Bhagavan*

śrī – a respectful form of address (also: absolute, highly revered wealth: knowledge, beauty, etc)

dakṣiṇāmūrti – the Lord invoked as the bestower of spiritual knowledge/wisdom

dakṣiṇāmūrti-svarūpāya – the one who is essentially Dakshinamurti himself

dayānanda-rūpāya – one who is in the form of Dayananda

paramagurave – to the exalted teacher (guru)

paramātmane – to the absolute self (himself)

bhagavate, svarūpāya, rūpāya, paramagurave, paramātmane are all in the dative case
namo is a *saṅdhi* form of the plural noun *namaḥ* - salutations
